

Cultural heritage of Kapušany and bearers of traditions

Kapušany Castle

A short history of the castle:

around 1249 - Tubul Castle on Mogloch Hill.

1347 - "locus castri Mogloch" (site of the demolished castle).

1410 - King Sigismund of Luxembourg gave the estate to Andrej de Koka, a burgher of Buda. Andrej founded the Kapy family, built the castle.

1440 - King Vladislav I. Jagelovský gave the castle to the nobles of Rozhanovce.

1464 - ownership of Jan of Kapušiany.

1468 - the castle was occupied by the Bratrici, at the end of the 15th century the Polish troops of Jan Albert attacked, the castle was damaged.

16th century - the castle rebuilt and enlarged with a lower courtyard and a moat. Outbuildings, craft workshops added. At the turn of the 16th - 17th century a guardhouse was added.

17th century - the manor moves to the manor house in Tulčík and the castle is transformed into a refugial castle (fulfilling the role of a refuge). The castle garrison remains in the castle and the nobility retreats here only in case of danger.

1686 - Imrich Tököly occupied the castle during the anti-Habsburg uprising.

1709 - the leader of the troops of Francis II. Rákoczi - Telekessy set the castle on fire.

1712 - after the return of the castle to the Kapy family, the widow of Gabriel of Kapy -Eva Gergelakyová, had the damaged castle repaired.

1715 - the castle was burnt down according to a government decree to prevent it from becoming the centre of the anti-Habsburg movement. Since then the castle has been uninhabited and deserted.

1963 - the castle was declared a National Cultural Monument.

2012 - the municipality of Kapušany started a comprehensive conservation and partial restoration of the castle.

2016 - opening of the administration building and the observation tower, lighting of the castle.
